Still no... sidewall sprinklers are normally used in LH only but some are listed for OH. None are listed for greater hazards than OH but the provision to allow the use of a SSW sprinkler is specific and was added to the standard based on full committee review of a proposal during a code cycle (2002 I believe). You are welcome to submit a proposal to add this allowance to the ECSW section but currently, that provision does not exist.

IF the overhead door is located within a light or ordinary hazard occupancy, I would say yes but not within a warehouse (storage) or EH occupancy.

Of course the local AHJ is within his or her purview to allow you to use the ECSW under §1.5 and 1.6

So would we be able to use extended coverage sidewalls below overhead doors, under rule 8.9.5.3.2? With the same criteria of ordinary hazard at roof and light hazard below doors, or even extended coverage sidewalls for ordinary hazard coverage below doors.

Example would be a 16x24 overhead door needing 1 extended coverage sidewall instead of 4 standard coverage sidewalls.

Please note that NFPA 13, 2010 edition, chapter 8, sections 8.6 through 8.12 each address spacing, location and obstruction rules for specific sprinkler types. The rules for section 8.7 only apply to section 8.7 as do the remainder of these sections.
